Creating Opportunities and Enhancing Capabilities

Last year was a fruitful and promising year at HCC. Our sponsors enabled us to reach many children through our educational support programs. Educational support for children in Nepal is critical to reduce school dropout and minimize the gender gap in school attendance, as well as to prevent child labor, early marriage and the danger of being trafficked. At the same time, our programs teach life skills, financial literacy, and career planning, all instrumental for students to become independent and help change our society for the better. In 2019, our programs directly helped 131 students in Nepal.


Our Signature Program students participated in many activities alongside their studies. They volunteered with other charities, like old age homes, animal rescue and environmental clean-up, to gain the experience of giving back. Mentorship training, workshops and trekking with international cultural exchange groups were some of the many pioneering activities done last year that inspired our students to see new possibilities for their futures. Career counseling helped them match to the right educational tracks for their career goals, and guided students interested in STEM to explore career paths that are currently in need of manpower in Nepal, specifically in the technology and healthcare sectors.

Our HCC team in Nepal also worked hard to ensure that our rural students in the districts around Kathmandu were safe, healthy and in school. We distributed educational materials, clothing and checked on their wellbeing. This rural program is instrumental to minimize early marriage and drop out rates for rural children.

We are growing everyday and very proud that our work has changed the lives of so many children and youth in need.

Our **Kathmandu Signature Program** students continue to impress us as they grow, excelling in their academic and creative endeavors. This year there were 38 students in the program - 25 in high school and 13 in university.

The **Rural Education Scholarship Program** continues to provide life changing education and support to orphaned or abandoned children in rural communities. In 2019, the RESP supported 84 students ages 6-18.

Our **Higher Education Scholarship Program** graduated its first student in 2019 and welcomed three new students! The program now has nine students, six of whom live in Kathmandu with HCC's Signature Program students.




Administration Fundraising Program 2% **Expenses** -2% Rural **Programs**
